The weighting of the module discussion activity or 'blog' in the Contemporary Study Skills has been changed from 5% to 25% to reflect the importance of the activity and the effort and time put in by students to this activity.

In addition the assignment in the Contemporary Study Skills module has been changed from two smaller assignments to one 3000 word assignment in oder for the students to demonstrate greater discussion and reflection. This also addresses the requirements for the RCVS criteria in preparation for application for accreditation
