There is a degree of variation in some students' performance, when comparing the relative outcome of either the written essay or their oral exams. While doing better on MCQs, some perform relatively poorly in the written papers.

Reiteration of the variegated set of individual skills necessary for a successful exam outcome, such as suggesting to look after their verbal communication skill as much as their written one.
