
Pugs Weighing up health priorities



CONCLUSIONS

- This study gives evidence on the rising popularity of Pugs, which has been associated with impulse purchasing, mass puppy breeding and importation from long distances.
- Many of the top disorders identified in Pugs are associated with their brachycephalic (flat-faced) conformation.
- This information can help to move the conversation on welfare from 'what are the issues' to 'how do we deal with these issues'.
