9.	Consequences of Failure				
9.1.	A student who fails at their first attempt is required to re	esit or withdra	aw from the course.		
9.2.	Students who do not pass Year 3 overall at the first attempt will be required to re-sit the component(s) failed. (i.e. Written Paper, PVP Reflective Assignment or DOPS station (Students will only have to re-sit the specific DOPS station(s) that they failed)).				
9.3.	Students who fail to achieve 50% overall and obtained MCQ papers and less than 50% in the Clinical Problen both areas.				

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9.4.	Students who fail to achieve 50% overall but obtained over 50% in one of Basic Factual MCQ or Clinical Problem Solving MCQ papers only have to retake the area in which they obtained less than 50%.
9.5.	Students who fail to achieve 40% in either Basic Factual MCQ or Clinical Problem Solving MCQ papers (irrespective of whether they obtained more than 50% overall) must retake the area in which they achieved less than 40%.
9.6.	Students who fail to achieve 50% overall, but obtained over 50% in Basic Factual MCQ and Clinical Problem Solving MCQ papers combined only have to resubmit the PVP Reflective Assignment.
9.7.	Students who have not satisfactorily completed at least 80% of the Student Record of Achievement by the end of year deadline will be required to repeat the entire year.
9.8.	The overall mark awarded at the second attempt will be capped at 50%.
9.9.	A student who fails at their second attempt will be required to withdraw from the course. They have a right of appeal as described in College Regulations.
10.	Classification
10.1.	A student who, at the first attempt, obtains an overall average mark of 70% or more, and a grade of "Safe" for each DOPS station, and satisfactorily completes the Student Record of Achievement, will be awarded a pass with Distinction.
10.2.	A student who, at the first attempt, obtains an average mark of 65%-69%, and a grade of "Safe" for each DOPS station, and satisfactorily completes the Student Record of Achievement, will be awarded a pass with Merit.
10.3.	A student who gains 40% or more overall in Year 3 and satisfactorily completes the Student Record of Achievement, will be eligible to transfer to the BSc Animal Health and Disease. A pass in the DOPS is not required in order to transfer.
11.	Disclosure of Marks
	Results will be published by candidate number.
12.	Absence from Assessment
12.1.	A student who defers one term's examination will be required to sit an equivalent examination to the one they missed or will be given the option to take the resit paper as a first sit (the latter will be particularly encouraged if the combined marks for the other two assessments are below 50%).
12.2.	A student who defers more than one termly examination will be required to sit the resit examination as their first sit (marks gained for any examination already taken will be void).
12.3.	A student who fails at the first attempt in the August/September resit period will be required to <u>EITHER</u> sit the termly assessments during the next academic year (encouraged) <u>OR</u> undertake the resit examination at the next available opportunity.
