



DIET TRIAL FOR DOGS WITH IDIOPATHIC EPILEPSY




HAS YOUR DOG BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH IDIOPATHIC EPILEPSY AND HAD AT LEAST 2 SEIZURES IN THE PAST 6 MONTHS?

WHAT IS HAPPENING

Epilepsy is the most common chronic neurological brain disease in first opinion practice for domestic dogs. Diet is increasingly recognised as having an impact upon the seizure activity and behaviour in dogs with epilepsy.





WHAT WE ARE DOING

Our LifeTIME (Long-term remission MCT epilepsy) study has been looking at the long-term influence of a medium-chain fatty acid diet in the management of idiopathic epilepsy in pet dogs. The first dogs have now completed the study, and we are now looking for more patients to potentially benefit from this management option.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

We are looking for dogs who:

- # Have been diagnosed with Idiopathic Epilepsy
- Are between the ages of 6 months and 12 years
- # Have had at least 2 seizures in the past 6 months
- Have NOT had a history of cluster seizures (2 or more seizures in a day) or status epilepticus
- Dogs already receiving antiepileptic medications will also be considered

All eligible patients entering the trial can benefit from a FREE diagnostic work-up, diagnostic monitoring and FREE diet for up to a year
