Within my specialist area, to my knowledge, these students are performing similarly to other students at level 5

Some of the highest performing students have achieved exceptional marks and the majority of the cohort have done well, though overall distinctions, merits and marks are a little lower than previously. Many of these students have faced considerable educational challenges in the past few years and this appears to be reflected here. The ISF orals are a very valuable way to appraise student knowledge and understanding but still prove challenging in terms of performance. Strategies under discussion with regard to in-person communication skills may help to support improvement of this element in the future.

The methods of assessment used are sound, covering knowledge and appropriate applications, and the CATR is a good opportunity for students to explore a specialized interest while developing and demonstrating scientific writing and critical analysis skills.

It was evident to the external examiners how much hard work and experience had gone into each stage of the assessments. the statistical analyses and wider moderation paperwork are robust, with appropriate actions having been taken based on these analyses.

The assessments and student performance are consistent with expectations at level 5
