6.	<b>Marking Criteria</b>			
6.1	<b>Multiple Choice Questions</b>	The number of marks available for each type of question will be clearly stated on the examination paper. A question left unanswered or deleted by the student will score zero. The pass mark for the MCQ examinations as a whole will be set according to approved and accepted standard setting protocols, normalised and then scaled.		
6.2	<b>Principles of Veterinary Practice (PVP) Assignment</b>	Will be marked according to the Common Grading Scheme (Reflective Writing).

<b>8.</b>	<b>Requirements to Pass Overall and Progress to the Next Stage</b>		
8.1	<p><b>First Sit</b> Following scaling of the marks, an aggregated average mark of 50% or more from the Written Papers and PVP Reflective Assignment combined. Students must achieve at least 40% in Basic Factual MCQ and at least 40% in Clinical Problem Solving MCQ when marks are combined for the three terms and 40% in the PVP Reflective Assignment.</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Satisfactory completion of at least 80% of the Student Record of Achievement</p>		
8.2	<b>Resit</b>		
8.2.1	Following scaling of the marks for any Written Papers that have been undertaken as a resit (in addition to the mark for a resubmitted PVP Reflective Assignment if required) an aggregated mark of 50% or more from the combined Written Papers and PVP Reflective Assignment (with marks carried forward for those elements scoring 50% or more at the first attempt). Students must achieve at least 40% in Basic Factual MCQ and at least 40% in Clinical Problem Solving MCQ (and at least 40% in the PVP Reflective Assignment, if a student was required to resubmit this component). The year mark for resitting students will subsequently be capped at 50%.		
8.2.2	For students who fail to meet the requirement of 80% completion of the Student Record of Achievement by the deadline stated for ratification at the first sit Exam Board, a new deadline will be given in time for ratification at the resit Exam Board and the year mark will be capped at 50%. Students who have an authorised deferral of an assessment during the course of the year will be required to meet this second deadline, but their year mark will not be capped. Students who fail to meet this second deadline will be required to withdraw from the course. They have a right of appeal as described in the RVC's Regulations.		
<b>9.</b>	<b>Consequences of Failure</b>		
9.1	A student who fails at their first attempt is required to resit.		
9.2	Students who do not pass Year 3 overall at the first attempt will be required to re-sit the component(s) failed. (i.e. Written Paper or PVP Reflective Assignment).		
9.3	Students who fail to achieve 50% overall and obtained less than 50% in the Basic Factual MCQ papers and less than 50% in the Clinical Problem Solving MCQ papers must retake both areas.		
9.4	Students who fail to achieve 50% overall but obtained over 50% in one of Basic Factual MCQ or Clinical Problem Solving MCQ papers only have to retake the area in which they obtained less than 50%.		
9.5	Students who fail to achieve 40% in the PVP Reflective Assignment must resubmit this component.

9.6	Students who fail to achieve 40% in either Basic Factual MCQ or Clinical Problem Solving MCQ papers (irrespective of whether they obtained more than 50% overall) must retake the area in which they achieved less than 40%.
9.7	Students who fail to achieve 50% overall but obtained over 50% in Basic Factual MCQ and Clinical Problem Solving MCQ papers combined only have to resubmit the PVP Reflective Assignment.
9.8	The overall mark awarded at the second attempt will be capped at 50%.
9.9	A student who fails at their second attempt will be required to withdraw from the course. They have a right of appeal as described in the RVC's Regulations.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Classification</b>
10.1	A student who, at the first attempt, obtains an overall average mark of 70% or more and satisfactorily completes the Student Record of Achievement, will be awarded a pass with Distinction.
10.2	A student who, at the first attempt, obtains an average mark of 65%-69% and satisfactorily completes the Student Record of Achievement, will be awarded a pass with Merit.
10.3	A student studying the 5-year programme (including students who entered via gateway and the BVSc route) who gains 40% or more overall in the Year 3 assessments (Written papers and PVP assignment), will be eligible to transfer to the BSc Animal Health and Disease. The SRA is not required in order to transfer. Students studying the 4-year BVetMed programme (Graduate Accelerated, GAB, programme) are not eligible to transfer to the BSc Animal Health and Disease due to not having accrued sufficient Credit Points.
<b>11.</b>	<b>Disclosure of Marks</b>
	Results will be published by candidate number.
<b>12.</b>	<b>Absence from Assessment</b>
12.1	A student who defers one term's examination will be required to sit an equivalent examination to the one they missed or will be given the option to take the resit paper as a first sit (particularly encouraged if the combined marks for the other part(s) of the assessments are below 50%).
12.2	A student who defers more than one termly examination will be required to sit the resit examination as their first sit (marks gained for any parts of the MCQ assessment they undertook are void).
12.3	A student who fails at the first attempt in the August/September resit period will be required to EITHER sit the termly assessments during the course of the next academic year (encouraged) OR undertake the resit examination at the next available opportunity (typically in August/September of the following academic year).
