JAMES BEE EDUCATOR PRIZES 2018/2019

About the Awards and Entry Conditions

- The objective of the Educator Prizes Scheme is to recognise staff who excel in providing an 1. excellent student learning experience. This may be demonstrated in various ways, such as:
 - excellence in the delivery of the curriculum
 - excellence in the development of the curriculum and/or teaching, learning and/or assessment methods
 - excellence in pastoral care.
- 2. There will be eight individual prizes, valued at £1,000 each (subject to tax).
- 3. Nominations must be made by SU Course Representatives. Nominations are invited for the following categories:
 - Tutor i.
 - **Project Supervisor** ii.
 - iii. Feedback
 - iv. Practical Teacher (including rotations)
 - v. Small Group Learning Facilitator (e.g. DLs)
 - vi. Support Staff Member
 - vii. PhD Supervisor
 - viii. Lecturer
- 4. All RVC staff engaged in teaching are eligible for an Educator Prize: the only proviso is that nobody may win a prize in two successive years. Visiting lecturers are eligible for Educator Prizes, but a cash prize will be awarded only where the individual concerned has made a substantial long-term contribution to teaching at the RVC. Only support staff are eligible for nomination as James Bee Support Staff Member.
- 5. The Educator Prize Scheme encompasses contributions to all the College's taught courses, both undergraduate and postgraduate.

- 7. Nominations, supported by citations that state why the nominee is considered excellent, are invited from all SU Course Representatives. Nominations must be submitted using the Nomination Form (see www.rvc.ac.uk/jimbee). Staff should NOT solicit nominations.
- 8. Winners are expected to share their good practice as a condition of the award. This might comprise a workshop, lunchtime seminar, teaching session, podcast, screencast, video, blog etc.
- 9. The deadline for submission of nominations is midnight on **Sunday 9 June 2019**.

- 10. Nominations are adjudicated by a panel comprising:
 - the Principal
 - the Vice-Principal (Learning Teaching and Assessment)
 - the Associate Deans
 - the President of the SUS
 - Departmental Teaching Co-ordinators
 - Head of Educational Development.
- 11. When nominations have been received, the panel evaluates them in the context of their latest set of student evaluation data.
- 12. Prizes are normally awarded at a Graduation Ceremony. A citation for the award will be read out at the ceremony.

13. Team project awards are adjudicated through a separate competition administered through LIVE. Details will be circulated by LIVE.
