2.	<b>Applicable to Academic Year</b> 2015/16
3.	<b>Applicable to</b> Students who have taken their Year 3 examinations since 2008/09
4.	<p><b>Aspects of Course Covered by Examination:</b></p> <p>Critical Literature Review. Candidates must normally submit a Critical Literature Review within six months of registration as a full-time student or twelve months if registered as a part-time student.</p>
5.	<p><b>Form of Examination:</b></p> <p>5.1 BVetMed Years 1, 2 and 3 examinations previously taken</p> <p>5.2 Project Report (RP2) from Final Year BVetMed* OR Critical Literature Review of between 7000 and 10000 words and associated Oral Examination</p> <p><i>*Applies to projects completed during Final Year in 2012 or later.</i></p>
6.	<p><b>Requirement to be Completed to Permit Entry to the Examination</b></p> <p>The student must have formally relinquished their registration for the award of BVetMed and have met the entry requirements of the course regulations.</p>
7.	<p><b>Marking Criteria</b></p> <p>7.1. <b>Critical Literature Review</b> The RVC Common (0-100) Grading Scheme.</p> <p>7.2. <b>Oral Presentations &amp; Oral Examinations</b> The RVC marking scheme for Oral Presentations will be used for all appropriate presentations and the marking scheme for Masters Research Project Oral Examinations will be used for appropriate Oral Exams.</p>
8.	<p><b>Allocation of Marks and Any Additional Requirements</b></p> <p>8.1 <b><u>Element 1: BVetMed Year 1 Result</u></b> <span style="float: right;">200 marks</span> This will be a maximum of 80 marks if the student passed at the second attempt having achieved less than 40% at the first attempt.</p> <p>8.2 <b><u>Element 2: BVetMed Year 2 Result</u></b> <span style="float: right;">700 marks</span> This will be a maximum of 280 marks if the student passed at the second attempt having achieved less than 40% at the first attempt.</p> <p>8.3 <b><u>Element 3: BVetMed Year 3 Result</u></b> <span style="float: right;">550 marks</span> This will be a maximum of 220 marks if the student passed at the second attempt having achieved less than 40% at the first attempt.</p> <p>8.4 <b><u>Element 4:</u></b> either of the two options below:</p>
