





The teaching hospital difference...

Final year veterinary students (who have completed all of their academic learning) work in RVC hospitals under the close supervision of our experienced veterinary team. They gain vital experience by applying their training to clinical cases in a real-life setting.

At the RVC Beaumont Sainsbury Animal Hospital, our veterinary students may greet you at reception or demonstrate how to use medication after your appointment. In consultations, we tend to use the clinical reasoning model for our cat and dog consultations, and the consulting skills model for our exotic pet consultations.

This may mean that your appointment takes a little longer than in a non-teaching hospital. Please rest assured that our first concern is always for the health and welfare of your pet. We really appreciate you taking the time to talk to our students and help us to train the vets of the future.

Clinical reasoning model _____

Stage 1



- Student starts the consultation
- · Takes a full history
- Performs clinical examination

Stage 2



- Student leaves consultation room to discuss case with experienced vet
- Student suggests possible treatments and client advice to the vet
- This is essential learning and reflection time for the student

Stage 3



- Vet and student return to consultation room
- Vet may ask further questions and examine pet
- Diagnosis and treatment options are discussed with the client
- Student will gain vital learning from comparison

What this means to you and your pet

Every patient benefits from multiple sets of veterinary eyes. Your pet receives the knowledge and experience of some of the profession's most experienced and qualified vets, as well as the care and enthusiasm of our talented next generation of veterinarians. All of our students have undergone a rigorous training programme before they join us in the hospital and work under close supervision, with strict guidelines for their involvement each day. We hope that you will find it rewarding to be part of the student journey and support a not-for-profit veterinary hospital rather than use a corporate practice for your pet.

- Vet will be in consultation room with the student, and will invite them to lead sections of the consultation
- Diagnosis and treatment options discussed with the client

Stage 2






- Vet and student discuss the case after consultation, enabling your pet's case further consideration

Overnight care

Should your pet require admission for overnight care at the RVC Beaumont Sainsbury Animal Hospital, rest assured that we have registered veterinary nurses on site 24 hours a day.

The hospital has spacious, species-specific wards for patients to recover in peace and quiet. Our nurses monitor and care for your pet throughout the night. We follow a tailor-made care plan arranged by the veterinary team to ensure your pet is well looked-after.

Our veterinary surgeons are on call if the registered veterinary nurses need them to attend your pet during the night.




Surgery and Imaging

The RVC Beaumont Sainsbury Hospital has four spacious and well-equipped theatres.

Our operating theatres have positive pressure ventilation to ensure the highest standards of sterility, making them suitable for both orthopaedic and soft tissue surgery.

Our dental theatre is equipped with dental radiography. This enables vets to visualise the roots of the teeth when investigating dental problems and performing dental procedures such as scaling, charting, extractions and tooth restoration.

The hospital also has digital radiography, ultrasonography, endoscopy and laparoscopic (keyhole) surgery equipment. These facilities allow our veterinary team to "see" inside your pet's body and understand what is causing illness.



Referrals

Sometimes pets need access to care or facilities outside of their general practice (similar to us being referred to a specialist by our GP). If your pet requires a referral to a specialist, the RVC Beaumont Sainsbury Animal Hospital team can arrange this easily for you.

The RVC referral service is world-leading in specialist care and research into unusual or complex conditions. Patients of the RVC Beaumont Sainsbury Animal Hospital are uniquely positioned to benefit from the close relationship between the RVC's general practice and referral services.





For cats and dogs, specialist referral services are located at our sister hospital, the RVC Queen Mother Hospital for Animals at Potters Bar (exotic patients may also need to visit this site to access CT scanning).





The Royal Veterinary College (RVC) Exotics Referral Service is based within our hospital in Camden so rabbits, small furries, reptiles and birds can access referral services without even leaving the hospital.





The Animal Care Trust (ACT) is the RVC's charity. The ACT raises funds to support projects across the RVC aiming to improve and develop veterinary medicine. Our charity works very closely with the RVC's hospitals, ensuring they have the best, most up-to-date equipment possible.

RVC Beaumont Sainsbury Animal Hospital has benefitted from ACT-funded specialist equipment as well as our dedicated ferret ward.


