SEVEN MOMENTS OF RESPONSIBLE CANINE PYODERMA TREATMENT

MORE CYTOLOGY

MORE BACTERIAL CULTURE

TOPICAL ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY

FIND & CONTROL PRIMARY CAUSE

CONFIRM PYODERMA Decide on the **ANTIBIOTIC** TREATMENT MODALITY Clinical signs + Cytology Topical +/- systemic (e.g. not Malassezia dermatitis) In some cases consider adding **TOPICAL TREATMENT** SYSTEMIC TREATMENT is always indicated. Treat until lesions resolved. (e.g. deep pyoderma) There is good evidence for efficacy of topical therapy alone for surface & superficial pyoderma, including MRSP infections Always **CULTURE** when previous treatment has failed, if repeated prior exposure to antimicrobials or in areas with a high MRSP prevalence Find and correct or manage **PRIMARY CAUSE** TREATMENT DURATION (e.g. ectoparasites, allergies, endocrinopathies) Aim for shorter courses (2 weeks for superficial pyoderma/ 3 weeks for deep pyoderma) and recheck before stopping











therapy. Treat until pyoderma lesions resolved.
